A Day at HomeFront During the COVID-19 Pandemic

9:00 a.m.

A client, \$3,000 behind on rent because her hours were drastically cut at work, needs assistance. We pay her landlord the balance due through our Homelessness Prevention Program.



10:00 a.m.

35 clients are lined up in the parking lot of our main office, waiting for Fran's Food Pantry to open so they can receive bags of groceries, fresh produce, eggs, chicken and personal hygiene products.

11:00 a.m.

11 long-time welfare recipients received job readiness/life skills training over Zoom to help them secure full-time work from volunteer tutors.



12:00 p.m.

22 clients have already visited our FreeStore in the morning where they "shopped" for clothing and household goods free-of-charge.



1:00 p.m.

Sara, a Senior Family Advocate at HomeFront's Family Campus, leads a workshop in stress management for parents experiencing homelessness.



2:00 p.m.

53 clients, volunteers, and staff are tested for COVID-19 during our routine weekly testing.



3:00 p.m.

The shingles are put on the roof at our newest permanent housing project on Lynwood Ave. in Hamilton. Come June 2021, sixteen families will move into brand new homes.



4:00 p.m.

Volunteers and staff visit six area motels to deliver hot meals to homeless families and individuals through our Double Helping Initiative.



5:00 p.m.

A mom comes to our main office and is given diapers, wipes and formula for her baby.



6:00 p.m.

23 kids in our Joy, Hopes, and Dreams program meet virtually for tutoring and to work on a new arts and crafts project that was delivered to their homes.



7:00 p.m.

32 clients attend a virtual parenting class led by the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Another 23 attend a virtual cooking class led by Wegmans Chef Cindy.



9:00 p.m.

A baby is born healthy and drug-free through our collaborative *For My Baby and Me* program for opioid addicted homeless mothers.
