

THE FAMILY PRESERVATION CENTER Sheltering Families for Over Twenty Years

The HomeFront Family Preservation Center (FPC), our emergency shelter program, recently celebrated its 20th anniversary in March. Over the last two decades, the FPC has helped nearly 3,000 families who have experienced homelessness. By offering services such as on-site childcare,

job training, intensive case management, and other life-changing programs designed to help families break the cycle of poverty, the FPC has had a significant impact on the communities it serves. HomeFront's innovative "one-stop shop" model has been nationally recog-

nized for its effectiveness and highlights the importance of providing comprehensive support services for families impacted by poverty and homelessness.

HomeFront's Family Preservation Center underwent a remarkable expansion in 2015, transforming from its initial beginnings on the grounds of the Katzenbach School for the Deaf into a fully-fledged wraparound resource. The opening of the Family Campus marked a significant turning point for HomeFront, as it now encompassed all the services that a family requires under one roof. HomeFront's Family Campus provides an array of support, from tutoring and health and wellness assistance to skill-building activities such as art and cooking classes. Thanks to HomeFront's expanded program, families in need now have a central hub where they can access an array of essential services and support throughout their journey towards stability and independence.

Gianna's story is a powerful example of the transformative impact that the Family Campus model can have on the lives of families in need. After leaving an abusive relationship, Gianna was struggling with depression and feelings of hopelessness. Thanks to the support of her family advocate, Gianna was able to create a plan for herself and enroll in our Hire Expectations job training program. Shortly thereafter, Gianna was able to find stable employment and move into

her own apartment, providing stability and security for herself and her young son. Her son continues to attend the Atkinson Child Development Center within the Family Campus, where he receives high-quality care and education. Through the dedication and commitment of the

HomeFront team, Gianna was able to turn her life around and create a bright future for herself and her child.

According to Sheila Addison, the director of the Home-Front Family Campus, a shelter must be much more than a place to eat and sleep. By providing a range of specialized services under one roof, the FPC has helped families achieve stability and build a brighter future for themselves and their children. "Almost everyone that comes to the shelter is dealing with significant trauma. They often struggle to move into an apartment and become self-sufficient because there are so many barriers in front of them," said Sheila.

"It is HomeFront's most important job to stabilize our families and then get them prepared to move on to independence. There is nothing more special to me than when I run into former shelter residents at the grocery store or the mall and they tell me how well they are doing. We give families the tools and resources they need to be self-sufficient, but more importantly, we give them hope for a different life."

- · With a charitable gift of appreciated securities held long-term, the donation you make and the deduction you get are greater than they would be if you were to sell the shares and donate the cash proceeds instead. That is because when you donate shares, you avoid paying the capital gains tax.
- Once you turn 70.5 you are required to take a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account(s) - [IRA(s)]. Those who meet the age requirement can transfer up to \$100,000 per individual, per year, directly to a qualified charitable organization — and, the donated amount is excluded from a person's federal taxable income.

These classes provide our kids with a deeper understanding of science, technology, and other STEM fields, which are vital for their future success in the workforce. Not only have they been able to learn new skills, but the program has also fostered strong relationships between the children and the coders. To show the kids that anyone can pursue a career in STEM, they even had an opportunity to visit the Morgan Stanley main office and meet coders of all backgrounds.







In addition to the various academic enrichment activities, the JHD kids participate in fun weekend activities. Another Diaper Challenge Completed and a Full Tractor Trailer Received!



In our annual Diaper Challenge we encourage local businesses and organizations to get involved and donate diapers and baby wipes. This year, we collected nearly 400,000 diapers and wipes in just two months!

Huggies, through a partnership with the National Diaper Bank Network, visited HomeFront's Diaper Resource Center with a tractor trailer of 52 pallets of diapers in tow! Their generous donation sponsored two months of diaper distribution through our food pantries.

The average parent spends between \$80 to \$100 a month diapering their baby, and the costs have risen significantly in the last year due to inflation. Any parent knows that raising a child comes with a host of challenges and for parents impacted by poverty and homelessness, always having a clean diaper for their child can be a luxury. HomeFront is on track to distribute over 2,000,000 diapers and baby wipes by the end of the year.
